

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



THE (UN)OFFICIAL TOP 10 BEACHES

With over 30 beaches to choose from along the Clarence Coast, we've narrowed it down to a list of 10 iconic spots (in no particular order).

BLUFF BEACH ILUKA
Enjoy 360 degree views from the
whale watching platform at the end of a
2.5 kilometre rainforest walk. Sheltered
from the southerly winds and patrolled
during the Christmas and Easter
holidays. A firm family favourite.

WHITING BEACH YAMBA

Where the Clarence River meets the ocean. A great place for little ones, with calm and shallow waters. Great for paddle boarding and taking things easy.

PIPPI BEACH YAMBA
A great two-in-one. Head north
for the popular surfing and fishing
corner or south for the off-leash dog
beach where your furry friend can join
in the fun.

SPOOKY BEACH ANGOURIE

There's nothing scary about this place, despite its name. A surfer's favourite, and the nearby Blue and Green Pools are a short walk up, around and to the side, down a crooked little track. What an adventure!

BACK BEACH BROOMS

Take the short track to Brooms

Head Back Beach and as the bush
clears, you'll get that magical 'ah'
moment when the postcard-perfect
beach and rock formations reveal
themselves. Race you to the water!

SANDON
Ssshhh, *whispers* you have to see it to believe it, but that's all we can say about this one.

Affectionally known by locals as 'The Mouth' or 'The Bay', this popular inlet is a family favourite. Where the Wooli Wooli River heads out to sea, tucked behind the break wall for added protection and secret summer days away from the world!

Neighbouring possibly the most hidden camping gem within the Clarence Valley, Diggers Camp Beach is secluded and serene. A quiet haven for a truly off-grid experience.

MINNIE WATER BEACH
A one kilometre stretch of
coastline, known as "Minnie Water
Beach", offers a place to launch your
boat to the south and all the amenities
the family may need to the north.
Patrolled during summer holidays, this
is a good one for the whole family. The
southern end is perfect for snorkelling
and seeing 'what's in the bay'.

YAMBA MAIN BEACH

The only beach with its own ocean pool. Take advantage of regular Surf Life Saving patrols throughout the warmer months. Yamba's Main Beach offers disabled access, disabled parking, amenities, and picnic tables. You can really make a day of it here.

ADVENTURES AND THE ENCHANTING MERMAID AWAIT

Welcome to Iluka, nestled between UNESCO World Heritage-listed rainforests and pristine coastline.

Stroll through **Iluka Nature Reserve**, where bird calls echo through NSW's largest remaining "by the sea" rainforest. It's a paradise for birdwatchers, with over 140 species to spot as you wander along the serene **Iluka Rainforest Walking Track**.

Iluka Bluff offers spectacular views over the Pacific Ocean, perfect for whale watching and enjoying a well-earned picnic after your adventure. Bring your bikes, boards, and fishing gear to enjoy the ocean and river. Rumour has it that **Iluka Beach** is the place to show off your angling prowess, but we aren't making any promises!

Nature's splendour continues in **Bundjalung National Park**, offering fishing, hiking, camping, and kayaking along the **Esk and Jerusalem Rivers**. As the sun sets, unwind at **Woody Head Campground**, a tranquil spot with unspoiled beaches and the soothing rhythm of the ocean.

Take a wander down **Charles Street**, and you'll know right away you're somewhere special. With friendly faces, a laid-back atmosphere, and a handful of quirky boutique shops, Iluka's charm will make you want to stick around longer than planned. And of course, keep an eye out for the legendary **Iluka Mermaid Sculpture**, which is said to guide local trawlers and symbolise the deep connection between land and sea. Trust us—you'll feel right at home here.

SURF, SEAFOOD AND SERENITY

Yamba is one of those weirdly magical places that makes you feel nostalgic for it, even while you're here. With stunning headlands, an array of beaches to suit every mood, and a small-town charm from yesteryear, Yamba feels like a cherished memory come to life.

Choose to experience the waterways with fishing and boat charters, river cruises or whale watching tours. Take a swim in the **Yamba Ocean Pool** at **Main Beach**, teach the kids to surf at **Turners** or paddle board along **Whiting Beach** for those who prefer calm waters.

Ride or walk the river pathway along the break wall, suitable for little legs and furry friends on a leash. Atop **Pilot Hill**, the iconic lighthouse offers panoramic views of the beaches and river mouth — a perfect spot for breathtaking sunrises.

With a delightful mix of dining options and cuisines for every taste bud, Yamba is a foodie's haven—where famous Yamba prawns can be found on almost every menu. Hungry for some retail therapy? Hit the shops for a blend of boutique fashion labels and artisan treasures hidden in

every nook and cranny in the centre of town.

A short five minute drive out of town, **Angourie** offers famous surf breaks and is home to the **Blue and Green Pools**. A charming seaside town on the northern tip of **Yuraygir National Park**, Angourie is the start (or end) point of the **Yuraygir Coastal Walk**, depending on which way you travel!

With beautiful beaches and inviting rock pools right on your doorstep, **Brooms Head** promises unforgettable moments in nature, making it the perfect getaway for families and friends alike.

MINNIE WATER & WOOLI

COASTAL TREASURES

Just when you think you've uncovered all the coastal gems of the Clarence Valley, the towns of Minnie Water and Wooli reveal even more to explore.

The **Wooli Wooli River**, with its crystal clear waters, offers a plethora of aquatic adventures, including kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding, and boat hire. Wooli is also the starting point for the final section of the **Yuraygir Coastal Walk**, where hikers can immerse themselves in a breathtaking wilderness filled with untouched beaches and rugged headlands. Underwater adventurers will love exploring the **Solitary Islands Marine Park**, home to diverse habitats from sandy shores to vibrant reefs.

Just north of **Wooli** lies **Minnie Water**, surrounded by magnificent coastal bushland and forest tracks showcasing diverse ecosystems, from mangroves to salt marshes. As one of the older fishing settlements on the coast, Minnie Water features a picnic area, a patrolled beach, and a vehicle beach access track. Together, Minnie Water and Wooli offer unforgettable experiences where nature and adventure await around every corner.





HAVE A WHALE OF A TIME ON YAEGL COUNTRY

Attention winter travellers! You're not alone in seeking warmer weather — whales are on the move too! From May to October, these magnificent creatures migrate from frigid Antarctic waters to warmer breeding grounds, making the Clarence Valley a top whale watching hotspot. With 70 kilometres of coastline to choose from, here are our top six whale watching hotspots.

WOOLI

Furthest south and nestled between the Yuraygir National Park and the Pacific Ocean, Wooli is the ultimate whale watching nook. Check out Wooli Beach, Wilsons Headland, and Diggers Camp for the best views. Grab a local fishing charter and turn your day into a whale of a tale!

MINNIE WATER

Just up the coast, there's nothing mini about the mighty views in Minnie Water. Head to Waratah Crescent's picnic area or the lookout on Beach Street. For a comfy stay, camp at Illaroo Campground or enjoy family fun at Minnie Water Holiday Park.

BROOMS HEAD

This spot is a family tradition for many. Set up camp at Brooms Head
Holiday Park under the Norfolk Pines

and keep your eyes peeled for whales. For a better view, hike up to Brooms Head Lookout. The last one to spot a whale buys lunch!

YAMBA

Adventure out into the deep blue on one of the local charters or if you prefer staying on land, Pilot Hill (that's the one with the lighthouse) offers sweeping ocean views. Look out for a glimmer of something splashing on the horizon, Yep, that's a whale showing off and giving a wave. Hi friends!

ANGOURIE

Famously known as the best point break in Australia, Angourie is not just for surfers, it's also a whale watching paradise with not one but two lookouts. The scenic Angourie Walking Track leads to Dirrangan Lookout

where epic views of the Pacific await. Pack your sense of adventure for this one, oh, and wear comfy shoes.

ILUKA

Follow the Iluka Rainforest
Walking Track for a spectacular reveal
over the stunning ocean vistas at
Iluka Bluff. Pack a picnic, bring your
binoculars, and play "Spot the Whale"
with the kids!






AHOY! A MARINERS GUIDE TO THE CLARENCE RIVER

Simply put, the broad waters of the lower river are ideal for sailing, boating or fishing, and the upper reaches and the many tributaries offer excellent canoeing, kayaking and fishing opportunities.

The **Clarence Cruising** guide is an expansive affair combining practical information on marinas, jetties, pontoons, provisioning, hazards, bridges and the like, with some general recommendations about places you may wish to step ashore and explore as you make your way up this glorious river.

JOURNEY THROUGH OUR NATIONAL PARKS



With nearly 50 per cent of its landscape designated as a national park and state forest, the Clarence Valley is a treasure trove of stunning natural areas that highlight the region's diverse ecosystems and rich biodiversity. From Iluka Nature Reserve, part of the Gondwana Rainforests of Australia, to Yuraygir National Park and the 65 kilometre coastal walk found within it, these parks are home to unique flora and fauna and offer the perfect setting for outdoor activities such as hiking, bird watching, and camping.

BUNDJALUNG NATIONAL PARK

Stretching from **Iluka** to **Evans Head**, **Bundjalung National Park** offers a combination of river, beach and freshwater lagoons. Unique rock formations along the Iluka peninsula provide a rock pool playground for marine life to thrive and humans to explore.

Rest your head at **Woody Head Campground**, a firm family favourite for those who enjoy a weekend getaway by the beach. Make the most of the protected beach, boat ramp and onsite facilities. Suitable for caravans, trailers, and tents, you will need to book ahead — and don't forget your fishing rod!

ILUKA NATURE RESERVE

Welcome to the most extensive strip of diverse rainforest found anywhere in the world — the **Gondwana Rainforests of Australia World Heritage Area** and the **Iluka Nature Reserve** that lies within. Nestled between the Clarence River and the coastline, Iluka Nature Reserve is the largest remaining stand of littoral 'by the sea' rainforest in New South Wales. With over 180 unique species of plants and an abundance of wildlife, including over 140 bird species, the **Iluka Rainforest Walking Track** is a great way to explore this special place. Take a stroll through the lush rainforest before emerging at **Iluka Bluff** for a swim or spot of whale watching.

YURAYGIR NATIONAL PARK

Located between Yamba and Coffs Harbour, Yuraygir National Park is the state's longest stretch of undeveloped coastline. With 65 kilometres of rocky headlands, isolated beaches, cliffs and even a lake or two, the national park is also set against a backdrop of forests, heaths, and wetlands. Discover rare wildlife, remote campgrounds, idyllic picnic spots, and charming villages dotted along the coast. Swim, fish or surf to your heart's content in this aquatic playground. Bring your binoculars for whale watching between May and October, or challenge yourself on the Yuraygir Coastal Walk; a four-day hike over 65 kilometres through striking coastal scenery.

YURAYGIR COASTAL WALK


Follow the ancient wandering trails of Australia's coastal emus on this multi-day **Yuraygir Coastal Walk**, a 65 kilometre signposted track that traverses the coastline from **Angourie** to **Red Rock**. Tackle the full 65 kilometres over several days, stopping at one of the seven camp spots along the way or breaking the track up into bite-size pieces. The track is best walked north to south, so the sun remains behind you, as you walk past heathland plains, long sandy beaches, creeks, lagoons, and rocky headlands. This adventure requires a few river crossings, so tide times and safe crossing plans are imperative. This trip requires accurate planning so please check out the National Parks and Wildlife Service website for up-to-date information.

NYMBOI-BINDERAY NATIONAL PARK

Offering spectacular scenery along the **Nymboida River** for experienced kayaking and whitewater rafting enthusiasts, the **Nymboi-Binderay National Park** is a popular destination to enjoy a guided tour. Experienced bushwalkers will love exploring the park's landscape on foot along unmarked trails, through tallowwood trees and coachwood rainforest. The stunning rainforests and extensive old forests in Nymboi-Binderay provide a habitat for a variety of threatened animals like the powerful owl and stuttering frog as well as the more commonly known koala and kookaburra. Plus, amongst the park's 55 metre tall eucalypts, you'll discover the remnants of the early timber industry and historic days of the axe, crosscut saw and steam tramways.

EVERLASTING SWAMP NATIONAL PARK

Known to bird watchers as the 'Kakadu of the South', **Everlasting Swamp National Park** is one of the largest freshwater wetlands on the NSW North Coast. Located near **Lawrence**, north of **Grafton**, this is a hot spot for bird watching enthusiasts, so don't forget your binoculars. As the wetland changes with the season, you can expect various conditions and wildlife depending on the time of year and weather. The National Parks and Wildlife Service has preserved features from the wetland's history. Within the national park, you can expect to find historic levees, a water trough, fence posts and a holding yard, which all showcase the landscape's past use for cattle and cane farming.



This isn't an exhaustive list of all the parks in the region, and there are plenty more nearby that we can't cover. There's Washpool National Park and Gibraltar Range National Park, located northwest of Grafton, offering bushwalks ranging from half an hour to several days, showcasing some of the most diverse forests in New South Wales. Then there's Guy Fawkes National Park, nestled between Armidale, Grafton, and Dorrigo. This rugged wilderness is perfect for peaceful camping and hiking, allowing you to escape the crowds and immerse yourself in nature. Nestled on Yaegl Country, Maclean uniquely blends the charm of a river village with the character of a coastal town, serving as a vital connector in the Clarence Valley and the starting point for the Lower Clarence Aboriginal Tourist Drive. Just a stone's throw from the Pacific Ocean, Maclean exudes a delightful country vibe infused with the salty scent of the sea breeze.

Affectionately known as **Australia's Scottish town**, Maclean features over **200 tartan-painted power poles** that line its historic streets. Each Easter long weekend, the town comes alive for the annual **Maclean Highland Gathering**, showcasing vibrant pipe bands, traditional dancers and the exciting Highland Games.

McLachlan Park is perfect for boating, with a pontoon and an undercover deck offering barbecue amenities for a relaxing riverside picnic. For breathtaking views of the Clarence Valley, visit Maclean Lookout and the striking rock formation known as **The Pinnacles**. 


COUTTS CROSSING

THE LONGEST MAPPED WHITE WATER TRAIL IN AUSTRALIA

Stretching over 195 kilometres from Nymboi-Binderay National Park to Copmanhurst, the

Clarence Canoe and Kayak Trail

offers some of the most diverse paddling conditions found anywhere in the world.

The trail has three stunning river systems at your fingertips—the **Nymboida**, **Mann**, and **Clarence** rivers. One moment, you'll be gliding serenely along glassy waters, soaking in the stunning scenery; the next, you'll be navigating thrilling Grade 3 or 4 rapids with names like "Tombstone" and "Demolition Derby" that will get your adrenaline pumping!

Don't worry if you're not an extreme adventurer — this trail has eight sections with varying levels of difficulty, perfect for families and novice paddlers. Get the most out of your adventure and head out with a local guide or operator — they know the river like the back of their hand and can share some top tips to keep your paddle safe and fun.

Always check the river levels before your trip at **bom.gov.au**

Check your skill level (minimum standard):

Experienced: Ability to paddle Grade 3+ rapids with confidence.

Intermediate: Ability to run Grade 2 rapids with confidence.

Novice: Ability to manoeuvre canoe with confidence.

FIND THE RIGHT SECTION FOR YOU

THE JUNCTION TO CARTMILL PARK

A great open section, suitable for canoes, with numerous Grade 1 to 2 rapids and two Grade 3 rapids.

Skill level: Intermediate Distance: 24km (6-8hrs) River Grade: 2-3

2 CARTMILL PARK TO BUCCARUMBI

A long but fairly easy day trip suitable for most paddlers featuring long pools separated by occasional rapids. An early start is advisable as there is no easy intermediate access or egress.

Skill Level: Intermediate Distance: 28km (7-9hrs) River Grade: 2

BUCCARUMBI TO NYMBOIDA RIVER CAMPGROUND

Mostly long pools separated by fast flowing races and occasional rapids. A great open section, suitable for canoes, if care is taken on the rapids.

Skill Level: Intermediate Distance: 22km (6-8hrs) River Grade: 2

4 NYMBOIDA RIVER CAMPGROUND TO JACKADGERY

This stretch generally flows through the remote Nymboida National Park. Canoeists should be experienced and well prepared as there are a few long Grade 3 rapids that can be difficult in higher water and several Grade 4 rapids where portages are required.

Skill Level: Experienced Distance: 23km (6-8hrs) River Grade: 3-4

JACKADGERY TO CANGAI BROADWATER

The river is generally wide with long pools broken by occasional rocky races or rapids. The rural outlook is pleasant and mostly cleared with low gravel banks. It is suitable for touring canoes and novice paddlers in the company of experienced tour guides who are aware of the location of Cangai Falls rapid.

Skill Level: Novice (if accompanied by an intermediate paddler)
Distance: 27km (5-7hrs)
River Grade: 2



CANGAI BROADWATER TO THE GORGE

The journey along the Mann river to the junction of the Clarence river is predominantly gentle with long pools interspersed with rocky, fast flowing aces. Two kilometres downstream of the junction, along the Clarence river, the Clarence Gorge is entered and needs to be treated with great care.

Skill Level: Intermediate **Distance:** 22.5km (overnight)

River Grade: 2

THE GORGE TO WINEGROVE

After the Clarence Gorge, the river down to Winegrove is predominantly a series of long pools separated by gentle races and a few easy rapids. This section would normally be canoeable in all bar the driest of seasons as the river has now become more reliable.

Skill Level: Intermediate Distance: 30km (overnight)

River Grade: 2

WINEGROVE TO COPMANHURST

Mainly flat water with some fast flowing races. Suitable for novices wanting to experience open canoe paddling.

Skill Level: Novice **Distance:** 20km (4-5hrs)

River Grade: 1




Together, they operate mills at Harwood, Broadwater, and Condong, along with a refinery right at Harwood.



ICONIC FESTIVALS AND EVENTS

The Clarence Valley is a vibrant region bursting with unique and diverse events, each reflecting the character of our towns and the passions of our communities. The **Maclean Highland Gathering**, held over the Easter long weekend, has provided authentic Scottish experiences for 120 years! This two-day event includes a lively Friday night street ceilidh, a vibrant street parade, and a crowd favourite, the massed Scottish pipe bands. With bagpipes, caber tossing, Highland dancing, and plenty of tartan, the town comes alive in a celebration of culture.

Glenreagh Timber Festival, held in July, celebrates the town's logging history with timber sports, displays of vintage machinery, and plenty of family fun, bringing the area's past to life in a lively celebration.

The 10-day **Grafton Jacaranda Festival**, from late October to early November, is Australia's longest-running floral festival. The community turns purple-crazy with blooming jacarandas as parades, markets, and entertainment take over the town.



MUSEUM TRAIL

For a deeper journey through time, the region's beloved museums are ready to welcome you. Each museum provides a unique window into the past, inviting you to take a trip down memory lane and experience the enduring history of the Clarence Valley.

GLENREAGH MEMORIAL MUSEUM

Discover relics from the gold mining era and early timber industry at this small but fascinating museum. It highlights the industries that helped shape the Glenreagh area.

2 REMEMBER WHEN COTTAGE MUSEUM

This 100-year-old cottage is the perfect setting for morning tea and a look into daily life from days gone by. Enjoy a broad collection of artworks, photographs and relics from the regions businesses and agricultural industry.

3 SCHAEFFER HOUSE MUSEUM

This beautiful Federation-era home, built in 1900 and classified by the National Trust, showcases colonial artwork and war memorabilia. It is also home to the Clarence River Historical Society Research Centre, offering an in-depth look at the region's past.

ALUMNY CREEK SCHOOL MUSEUM

A unique piece of history, this museum preserves the heritage of rural education. Explore an authentic 1930s classroom, cloakroom, and teacher's residence, now home to a collection of school memorabilia.

(5) COPMANHURST SADDLERY MUSEUM

Once used as a saddle shop, this small building is a treasure in this rural community, giving visitors an intimate look at the everyday life of the community's early settlers. You'll find a collection of historical photos, saddles, bridles, and household items from the early 1900s.





6 LAWRENCE MUSEUM

Housed in the former 2NR Broadcasting Station beneath the iconic 1936 radio mast, the museum offers a fascinating glimpse into the region's riverine history. Located on the hill above the Bluff Point Ferry on the Clarence River, it features artifacts on trade, transport, agriculture and local life, preserving the past for future generations.

MACLEAN DISTRICT MUSEUM AND STONE COTTAGE

Enjoy Maclean District Museum with its displays on Yaegl culture, Maclean's Scottish beginnings, agriculture, boating, plus replicas of an early schoolroom and hospital. The adjacent Stone Cottage, completed in 1889, recreates a typical home from the turn of the century.

YAMBA MUSEUM

The Story House welcomes you to the essence of coastal life with exhibits on the town's maritime past and the stunning Yaegl Cultural Garden. The adjacent Old Kirk Building hosts exhibitions, making it a dynamic spot for both history and contemporary culture.

ILUKA MUSEUM

Located in the Soldiers Memorial Hall, proudly built by the community in 1923, this museum offers insights into coastal life. Displays include the Clarence Breakwater Scheme, the old Iluka Railway, and the local fishing industry, alongside local war memorabilia.

For a closer look at some of the iconic buildings that line the streets, don't forget to pick up a self-guided heritage trails brochure, at a Visitor Information Outlet or hub, to explore the historical streets of Grafton, Ulmarra, Maclean, and Yamba.

ART GALLERY TRAIL

Creativity and community come together in a vibrant celebration of visual storytelling on the Art Gallery Trail. Our region is home to a dynamic array of art galleries, each offering a unique glimpse into the heart and soul of our local culture. We welcome you to follow the meandering path of the Clarence River as you chase art across the valley, experiencing the region through the eyes of our talented creatives.

11 GRAFTON REGIONAL GALLERY

Grafton Regional Gallery, housed in the historic Prentice House and a new state-of-the-art extension, delivers art and cultural experiences for visitors and locals alike with nationally-recognised exhibitions and events that showcase contemporary art, and more. Grafton Regional Gallery is home to the prestigious Jacaranda Acquisitive Drawing Award.





COLDSTREAM GALLERY ULMARRA

Coldstream Gallery in Ulmarra features a diverse collection of contemporary artworks, blending the creations of both local and non-local artists. This gallery offers a cultural experience rich in history, set in a building more than 115 years old and has been home to a fine art gallery since 1975.

3 COWPER ART GALLERY AND STUDIO

Located in the picturesque village of Cowper, nestled by the banks of the Clarence River, the Cowper Gallery offers an ongoing program of exhibitions featuring contemporary art and crafts. With a growing schedule of workshops, this gallery provides a wonderfully intimate and enriching experience.


7 ILUKA EMPORIUM
